Practical information

Venue

Address: Faculty of Medicine, Comenius University in Bratislava, Moskovska st. 2.

The building is located 5 minutes' walk from the hotel Saffron and 15 minutes' walk from the city centre and old town. You can also get to the venue from the city centre by trams No. 3 and 4 (exit "Americke namestie").

Arriving to Bratislava

From VIENNA AIRPORT (VIE)

Vienna airport (Vienna-Schwechat) is situated 40 kilometers west of Bratislava and it is one of the main gateways to Slovakia.

Buses to Bratislava from Vienna airport depart with 30 to 60-minute intervals. Tickets can be purchased directly in the bus or prior to your trip via the following websites:

The cost is about 10€, you can buy the ticket from the driver in the bus, however we recommend buying the ticket online in advance. When you arrive at the Bratislava bus station "Nivy" you can take a taxi to get to the hotel – this also should not be more than 8€.

Taxi transfer from the Vienna Airport ("Schwechat") to Bratislava, price: around 50€. You can book the taxi via the following websties:

From BRATISLAVA AIRPORT (BTS)

Bratislava city center is 15-20 minutes away from the airport. To get to the city center you can take a taxi for around 10€ or take the bus no. 61. To get to the hotel Saffron you should exit at "Racianske myto" stop and then you can walk around 15 minutes or take the tram No.3 and exit at the stop "Blumental".







Public Transport

Tickets for public transport can be purchased in a paper (from ticket-machines or kiosks) or electronic form (in the IDS BK app) They are valid for a certain period of time (minimum 30 minutes) for all means of public transport in the city and remain valid when changing from one means of transport to another. The paper tickets should always be validated inside the tram/bus. You can buy a 30-minute ticket for 0.9€, 24 hours ticket for 4€ and 3 days for 9€. TAXIS

Please note: never enter a taxi waiting on the street outside an airport or a station, and never try to hail a taxi! Call a taxi by phone, or use an app. Entering a waiting taxi usually ends up being very expensive. Many of these taxis are unregulated and charge exorbitant amounts. All decent taxi services run by phone/app appointments only.

It is less expensive to order a taxi over the phone or app. than to hire a taxi from a taxi stand or stop a taxi on the street. The minimum charge for a short-distance trip is around € 5. We recommend checking the price with the driver prior to getting in the vehicle. Every taxi must have a price list displayed in a visible location, and a fare meter must be used. Taxi drivers are obliged to issue receipts on request.

Covid-19 measures

Currently, the measures have been softened. A mandatory use of face mask is required only when visiting health care facilities, however, it continues to be the key preventive measure. Wearing the masks is highly recommended mainly in public transport and in interior places.

The face masks will be available at the venue, and antigen self-testing kit can be provided for those who are interested.

Visiting Bratislava

The capital city of Slovakia, Bratislava, stretches on both banks of the river Danube. It lies on the borders with Austria and Hungary, that makes the city the only one capital in the world that borders two independent countries. Bratislava and Vienna are the closest two capitals in Europe - only 60km far away from each other. It has a population of approximately 420,000 inhabitants, but it is estimated that over 500,000 people live in the city. Other names of Bratislava are Pozsony in Hungarian and Pressburg in German.

Good to know

Slovaks and Czechs

Slovaks are proud of their identity and language. Only a few foreigners are aware that the former Czechoslovakia was till 1992 a federation of two republics – Czech and Slovak – and that, historically, two official languages always existed side by side: the Czech and the Slovak languages, also that Czechs and Slovaks are two separate nationalities, despite being close.

National holiday

The 15th of September is a national holiday in Slovakia and all the shops and shopping centres will be closed.

Tips

Tips are usually rounded up; with higher expenses there is a rule of a 10% tip but the actual tip depends on your satisfaction. In ordinary restaurants the waiter will usually bring your bill, tell you the sum and wait until you pay. As a rule, the total sum including a tip is paid or you indicate by a gesture that they may keep the change.

Rounding of the cash payments

Since July 1, 2022 Slovakia introduced rounding of the value of purchases in order to significantly limit the circulation of 1 and 2 cent coins. The final amount of the purchase, which is paid in cash, will be rounded. Example: The purchase price is \in 8.22. If paying in cash, the value of \in 8.22 is rounded mathematically down. If paying by card, payment is 8,22.

Telephone code

The country code for Slovakia is 00421, Bratislava 02 (just 2 if calling from abroad); local telephone numbers have 8 digits.

The European emergency number 112 is free, available to you 24 hours a day from any landline, mobile phone or pay phone. If you are in an emergency situation, just simply dial the numbers 1-1-2, without dialling any country codes before the number and wait for the operator's reply. The operators should be able to cover the emergency call in the English language.
